## Admissions

### Requirements for admission to KAMITH:

Completion of application  
Admission test with a minimum score of 8<sup>th</sup> grade or higher  
High School Transcript or GED

Our certification training programs are free of charge.

### Grading:

Student performance is determined on the basis of the grading scheme below:

A = 90-100%  
B = 80-89%  
C = 70-79%  
D = 60-69%  
F = 59% and below

### Accreditation and Approvals

KAMITH is approved by the Division of Private and Vocational Schools of the Illinois Board of Higher Education (IBHE). KAMITH is not currently accredited by the Higher Learning Commission of the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools or the US Department of Education. The institution cannot guarantee the transferability to a senior institution is encouraged and should be planned as early as possible in the student's academic career.





## Certified Nurse Assistant

The Certified Nurse Assistant (CNA) program is a 12-week program designed to provide students with the knowledge and skills necessary to perform basic healthcare services required of nursing assistants.

The program is also designed to meet the curriculum requirements of the Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH). Successful completion of this program includes:

1. Demonstration of all 21 IDPH Nursing Assistant Patient Care Skills.
2. Completion of 80 hours of classroom lecture and lab.
3. 40 hours of clinical rotation at a hospital or long term care facility.

Upon satisfactory completion of this course students are eligible to take the state certification examination.



# Pharmacy Technician

## Course Objective

The Certified Pharmacy Technician program is a 10-week program delivered through a flexible virtual -learning format combined with a required in-person practicum to support hands-on skill development. Designed for working adults and independent learners, the program allows students to balance their education with professional and personal responsibilities.

The program includes 50 hours of online didactic instructions delivered through an interactive learning platform accessible from a personal laptop or desktop computer. Students receive academic support and guidance from experienced instructors and advisors throughout their coursework.

To reinforce theoretical knowledge with real-world application, students complete a 80-hours in-person practicum with varies pharmacies where they develop essential pharmacy technician skills in a supervised, hands-on learning environment.

## Course Objective

The pharmacy technician course is to help students build the knowledge and hands-on skills needed to start a career as a pharmacy technician. Students will learn pharmacy calculations, medication preparation, sterile techniques, pharmacy technology, and professional workplace skills. Graduates complete an externship for real-world experience and are prepared to pursue national certification as a Certified Pharmacy Technician (CPhT).
